



## **Hidden Springs Town Association Operational Plan for the Community Pools Under CDC, CDH Idaho and Rebound.Idaho.gov Guidelines**

Idaho moved to Stage 4 of the Idaho Rebounds plan. The Association's plan is based on criteria outlined in Idaho Rebounds Stage 4 Protocols for Outdoor Pools, Splashparks and Waterparks. The HSTA may be required to close the facilities in the event the state guidelines or requirements change and/or adjust accordingly should the Protocols for Outdoor Pools, Splashparks and Waterparks change. We will continue to follow the CDC and other governmental authorities' directives and do our part as a non-profit business and member of the Idaho community.

As a reminder, the pool facilities are, and always have been **"use at your own risk."** It is important that members and/or residents exercise good judgment regarding use of the facilities, especially during this pandemic. **STAY HOME IF YOU ARE FEELING SICK, HAVE A TEMPERATURE OR HAVE ANY OTHER SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19.** Please avoid the community facilities if you are not feeling well. We appreciate you erring on the side of caution if you are not sure if it is allergies or something else! In the event the HSTA is notified of a person testing positive for COVID-19 who may have come in close contact with others while using the facilities, we will immediately close and properly clean and disinfect the facility. Further, we will consult with local health authorities' for guidance and any specific instructions prior to re-opening, including notification to members and/or residents. Due to privacy regulations, we would not be at liberty to divulge any personal information regarding any individual(s) who test positive for COVID-19.

### **SANITIZING**

All participants must thoroughly wash and/or sanitize their hands upon entering, exiting, and throughout use of the pool facility. Sanitizer will be provided for your convenience in each of the restrooms and on carts. The carts at each pool will be stocked with hand sanitizer, disinfectant in spray bottles and disposable towels. **Participants must wipe down the pool furniture after use.** We appreciate everyone adhering to these cleaning protocols as it is everyone's responsibility to do their part to keep others as safe as possible and our pools open for the summer.

### **JANITORIAL CLEANING**

The janitorial company will perform once daily cleanings, seven days a week, of all high touch surfaces at the facility as well as the restrooms. They will also conduct a deep-clean once a week. The company will use disinfectants included on the EPA's list of effective disinfectants against COVID-19. <https://www.epa.gov/pesticide-registration/list-n-disinfectants-use-against-sars-cov-2>. If a biological incident occurs (vomit, blood, and/or fecal matter) please call 208-602-9836 or 208-447-9427. The Association staff will respond, close the pools and call the janitorial company to clean up the biohazard.

### **POOL CLEANING**

Our pool contractor will perform once daily cleanings, six days a week. The pools are CLOSED for 30-60 minutes each morning, six days a week for cleaning, testing and the addition of any necessary chemicals. According to the CDC, there is no evidence that COVID-19 can be spread to people through the water in the pool. Association staff will routinely check the chlorine levels seven days a week. If a biological incident occurs (vomit, blood, and/or fecal matter) please call 208-602-9836 or 208-447-9427. The Association staff will respond, close the pools and call the pool contractor to clean up the biohazard.

## **RISK MITIGATION**

To help mitigate possible exposure to COVID-19, we ask that you continue to follow the CDC's guidance on social distancing, washing hands frequently with soap and water and coughing or sneezing into a tissue and disposing of it immediately. **If you rearrange the furniture to accommodate your family group, please return it to the original location after use and sanitize it prior to leaving.** The COVID-19 specific operational changes and recommended CDC signage will be posted at the pools.

We thank you in advance for your cooperation in this community effort. The pools are for the pleasure of every member and/or resident and the operational changes and pool rules are in place to ensure the fun, enjoyment and safety of our neighbors.

In the event that the rules are not being followed and disregarded, members and/or residents may complete and turn in a Pool Incident Report to the Town Office. Incidents verified by multiple members and/or residents (signature and contact information included) or evidenced upon review of security camera, will result in the loss of pool privileges for the season. **Please note**, pool cards are issued by **lot**, therefore, **ALL** cards associated with the lot will be turned off.

If a member and/or resident is verbally or physically abusive to any Association staff member while they are at the pools performing maintenance tasks, the Ada County Sheriff will be called and the pools will be covered and closed for the season. We only mention it because it has happened in the past. Looking forward to a fun and enjoyable pool season.
